I've been plagued as of late by the annoying problem of misplacing things. I must say I do come by this naturally. I come from a long line of people who have written notes to themselves. Eventually, I do find those things I've misplaced (at least most of them). My problem as I'm looking for these items is I'm too often looking in the wrong places.

It sounds silly, doesn't it? But, it's true! If we would look only in the "right" places, we would find those things we need much more quickly.

This is exactly what the angel told the women when they arrived at the tomb on that first Easter morning. The women were looking for the body of Jesus so they could finish the embalming process. They were puzzled as to where the body could be. The angel said to the women, "Why do you seek the living among the dead?" (Luke 24:5) In other words, "Ladies, you're looking in the wrong place!"

As Christians, we NEED to celebrate Easter!

We've come through the Lenten season during which we look at our lives and the many times and ways we've "come up short". We recognize on our own we cannot achieve salvation – we need a Savior! We need Jesus! Yet, our human nature leads us to think, "God couldn't forgive me for all I've done. I first need to do something which will make me a bit more worthy to be forgiven." When *these* are our words, we'll certainly miss the announcement – "**HE IS RISEN!!**" We'll miss the announcement because we're looking for our Savior in the wrong places! We've looked to ourselves for salvation rather than to Jesus. We need to be reminded He is not locked in the tomb, but He lives! So, we need Easter to focus our lives upon Jesus' saving action for us!

Still, old habits die hard. We NEED to celebrate Easter every week because throughout the year we tend to look for salvation through things which cannot save us. It's true such things will satisfy us and make us happy – for a while. However, over time, such things begin to wither, tarnish, and erode until they are no longer satisfying for us. We then find ourselves with nothing which gives us value, meaning and direction for our lives. Every Sunday is a celebration of the Easter Gospel – "**HE LIVES!!**" It's this gospel which proclaims to us God's love for us is unstoppable! Not even having to see His Son die on the cross for our sins could keep Him from loving us, calling us to Himself, and seeking to provide for our every need! When we fail to focus upon God as our sole Lord and Savior, we're like the women at the empty tomb. We're seeking life among things which will only bring decay and death.

May we truly hear the Easter proclamation, "HE IS NOT HERE! HE IS RISEN! WHY DO YOU SEEK THE LIVING AMONG THE DEAD?" May this Good News lead us to seek life and salvation today and every day through our risen Lord, Jesus Christ!
